It's important that your child thrives not just academically, but also socially and emotionally. Here are some questions to explore in this area:

- **How do you handle discipline and behavioral issues?**
What's the school's approach to discipline? Does it focus on restorative practices, conflict resolution, or positive behavior reinforcement?
- **Is there a social-emotional learning (SEL) component to the curriculum?**

Daily Schedule and Extracurricular Activities

Understanding the school's daily rhythm and available extracurricular activities will give you insight into how the school balances academic work with play, creativity, and physical activity. Here are some questions to ask:

- What is a typical daily schedule?
- How much outside time do children get daily?
- What type of extracurricular activities are provided both during school and outside of school hours?
- Do children go on field trips or have other experiences?

Technology Usage

Here are some questions to ask regarding the school's approach to technology:

- How much tech time do children have on average each day?
- How are devices used in the classroom (e.g. research, online lessons, homework, games, free play)?
- What types of technology does this school have (SMART boards, 3D printers, tech labs, etc.)?
